Join lecturer Rev. Dr Czar Alvarez Osa in a course unit that introduces students to Saint Augustine, his life and works, and the world he lived in. Some fundamental historical and cultural milieus – Manichaeism, Skepticism, Neo-Platonism, Donatism, Pelagianism, and Arianism – will be analysed to help provide students with an understanding of the contexts within which Saint Augustine elucidated his theological thought. Theological topics then studied include: soteriology, sacraments, grace, creation, evil, knowledge of God, Trinity, and ecclesiology.

Father Czar is a Filipino priest affiliated with the Augustinian Province of Italy. He is the fourth of six children (and the only boy). He completed his religious and most of his academic formation in Rome: a Licentiate from the Pontifical Biblical Institute, and a Diploma in Patrology and a doctorate in Theology and Patristic Sciences from the “*Augustinianum*”. He was assigned to the Augustinian community at the San Agustin Centre of Studies in Quezon City and the University of San Agustin in Iloilo City where he presently works as an administrator, the Director for Theological Studies and Formation, and the Coordinator of Foreign Languages. He is active in teaching, writing articles, giving talks, seminars, recollections, and retreats.
